From the Kitchen Counter to the Concert Stage: On the Creation of Classical Music Today

On Sunday, October 17, the Seattle Classic Guitar Society had the honor to present a special Zoom workshop, *From the Kitchen Counter to the Concert Stage: On the Creation of Classical Music Today*, a conversation with Michael Partington and guitarist-composer, Bryan Johanson.


Bryan Johanson, born and raised in Portland, Oregon, has won major awards from St. Paul Chamber Orchestra, John F. Kennedy for the Performing Arts, the Aspen Music Festival Music and School, and many other prestigious international festivals and organizations. Along with works for the classical guitar, his compositions also feature symphonies, chamber works, song cycles, and choral works.

Michael Partington's October 16 concert at Benaroya Hall featured Bryan Johanson's *Sonata No. 4*, a work with seven movements, composed for him. In Michael's program notes for his concert, he explains "Sonata No. 4 for guitar solo was written in the early summer months of 2017. The choice of using seven movements, while at first glance may seem unusual, is actually within the framework of the extended sonata form. The traditional three-part form is maintained in the following way: the first three movements are played without a break; the fourth movement is in ternary form and the final three movements are played without a break as well. The first three and the final three movements each consist of a single character, while the central fourth movement has a more complex, multi-character nature. In addition to the unusual formal design, the piece employs the seldom used scordatura

of tuning the fifth string to Ab. The resulting sonority is strikingly rich."

The Zoom workshop was extremely informative and enlightening about the creative process for both the composer and the performer. Bryan considers

himself a scribe, where he starts with a blank slate, and continues to form a general idea or a stimulus in a particular genre, instrument, or concept. The music then starts evolving, sometimes as a trickle, and sometimes in a fast and furious way. For Bryan everything happens at once; the harmony, melody, timbre, and texture evolve into a fully formed piece of music. He utilizes his listening ability to pause on a chord and hold it, for instance while he hears the

orchestration or other parts of the music. He can also hear the music at a slower or faster tempo. All of the music is conceived inside of his own head and written by hand; he does not use computer notation programs. Bryan also doesn't compose at the instruments, unless he wants to. He mostly composes standing in his kitchen, with fragments of his works hanging on the walls, hence the very creative title of the workshop!

Bryan Johanson feels very strongly that music is a collaborative experience between the composer, the performer, and the listener. Music needs to communicate something to the listener in order to bring it to life. The music has a narrative voice, and tells a story.




