

### Dear Friends of the SCGS,

Welcome to the beginning of spring! The Seattle Classic Guitar Society had a wonderful online February concert and workshop with classical guitarist and composer Thomas Flippin, an original and versatile performer, who is also a champion of new music and equality in classical music. His very personal and moving program opened with music by two musical giants that the world lost last year, Chick Corea and Jorge Morel. He continued with exciting and diverse works by Arnaud Dumond, Brian Shank, and Florence Price. His own dynamic and heartfelt compositions included a piece for Theorbo and looper pedal called *Endless Loop, Endless Days*, a musical response to the pandemic and quarantine. The program ended with a wondrous arrangement of *Amazing Grace* by the innovative and eclectic performer and composer, Benjamin Verdery, who was also Thomas' professor in graduate school at Yale. The next morning Thomas offered an informative, entertaining, and thought-provoking workshop on *Understanding Great Guitar Compositions*. 



### RECORDING PANEL – Northwest Guitar Festival 2022 Thursday, March 31, 7:00-8:30pm - online



Recording and selling records and CDs has been a crucial element of a successful career in music since the beginning of the 20th century. In the digital age, it is easier to make quality recordings on one's own but may also be more difficult to sell and distribute one's recordings for a profit.

In this panel roundtable, we'll discuss the recording process from choosing software to microphone placement to getting music on the web. Veteran recording artists and engineers will share their experiences with preparing, recording, editing, mastering, packaging, and distributing their music. Moderators Tamara and Neil Caulkins will lead the larger discussion around motivations for recording and how artists can best realize their musical projects.

Panelists will address a wide range of issues related to recording such as project conception, equipment, acoustics, mic placement, mastering, duplication, formats (CDs, video, streaming, USBs, Downloads), artwork, distribution, and sales. Each presenter will speak to different aspects of their recording projects. This will be followed by a Q&A and discussion.
