

* * * Thomas Flippin Workshop Notes *

Thomas Flippin Workshop Greatness in Guitar Composition: The Logic of Artistic Expression

On Sunday, February 13, Thomas Flippin offered an informative, entertaining, and thoughtprovoking online workshop on "Understanding Great Guitar Compositions". Thomas' workshop began with an interactive exercise, where everyone wrote down their five favorite classical guitar compositions, and then their own favorite piece to listen to or play the most. Through video and musical examples, Thomas guided the attendees through traits of great guitar compositions, what to listen for while playing and choosing music, and interesting things to consider as a performer, listener, and/or composer. One example that Thomas brought to the workshop is the very famous and often played Anonymous "Spanish Romance." He opened the discussion about this popular arpeggio piece, which has a very beautiful melody and harmony, but falls short of conveying nuanced and complex feeling, and does not introduce at least two good ideas within the musical landscape. While it does shift from E minor to the parallel E major, it does not continue to develop throughout the musical story. The one-hour workshop continued with a wealth of ideas for the performer's, audience's, and composer's toolboxes. Thomas opened more discussions about other great guitar compositions, such as *Etude 1* by Heitor Villa-Lobos; Suite Compostelana: Prelude by Federico Mompou; Bagatelle No. 5 by William Walton; Hocus Pocus: II. Shamans by Clarice Assad; and Prince's Toys: Tin Soldier by Nikita

Koshkin. The engaging discussions dove into the deeper levels of interpreting, composing, and listening to music. In conclusion, Thomas left us with these thoughts: "Composition is a balance of consonance and discord. Of tension and release. Of climax and aftermath. Great music is whatever music uses the aforementioned tools you like best in the proportions you like best."


