ANA VIDOVIC (CROATIA) - SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 8th, 2014, 7:30 pm



The Seattle Classic Guitar Society is thrilled to present world renowned virtuoso guitarist, **Ana Vidovic**, on the International Series. Her previous performance here several years ago was an amazing and memorable experience so get your tickets now and don't misss this concert as it may sell out quickly.

Ana Vidovic is an extraordinary talent with formidable gifts taking her place amongst the elite musicians of the world today. Ms. Vidovic has given over one thousand public performances since first taking the stage in 1988. Her international career includes recitals in New York, London, Paris, Vienna, Salzburg, Rome, Budapest, Warsaw, Tel Aviv, Oslo, Copenhagen, Toronto, Baltimore, San Francisco, Houston, Austin, Dallas, and beyond. Mel Bay Publications released Ana Vidovic's most recent DVD in 2009, "Guitar Artistry in Concert," a journey through the music of Torroba, Piazzolla, Pierre Bensusan, Sergio Assad, Stanley Myers, Villa-Lobos and Agustin Barrios. "Guitar Virtuoso," Ana's performance of works by Bach, Torroba, Paganini and Walton, was released on DVD by the Mel Bay label in 2006. Ana Vidovic comes from the small town of Karlovac near Zagreb, Croatia, and started playing guitar at the age of 5, and by 7 had given her first public performance. At the age of 11 she was performing internationally, and at 13 became the youngest student to attend the prestigious National Musical Academy in Zagreb. Ana's reputation in Europe led to an invitation to study with Manuel Barrueco at the Peabody Conservatory where she graduated in 2005. Ms. Vidovic has won an impressive number of prizes and international competitions including first prizes in the Albert Augustine International Competition, the Fernando Sor competition, and the Francisco Tarrega competition in Spain. Other top prizes include the Eurovision Competition for Young Artists and the Young Concert Artists International Auditions in New York.

Announcing the 2014-2015 Frye Art Museum Guitar Series:

Jesse McCann (USA) - Saturday, November 29th, 2014, 2:00 pm



Jesse McCann is hailed as one of the Pacific Northwest's most talented guitarists. He has won numerous awards in solo and chamber guitar categories and is a member of the critically acclaimed Oregon Guitar Quartet. Mr. McCann studied the guitar under the direction of Croatian guitarists Miroslav Loncar and Natasha Klasinc and later the American composer Bryan Johanson. He has also had the honor of working with influential guitarists such as Dusan Bogdanovic, Scott Tenant, David Tanenbaum, and Jason Vieaux. In addition to performing, he is quickly earning a reputation as one of Portland's best teachers of guitar and is highly sought after by prospective students. He works alongside his mentor and former teacher, Bryan Johanson helping run the guitar program at PSU and often assisting in the proofing and editing process of quartet arrangements, publications and other compositions. In 2014, Mr. McCann will be a guest performer and instructor for the GFA Convention and is later scheduled to perform solo concerts in Italy.

YOVIANNA GARCIA ALVARADO (PUERTO RICO) - SATURDAY, JANUARY 17th, 2015, 2:00 pm



Puerto Rican guitarist Yovianna García Alvarado is a unique, rising artist in the classical guitar world, offering cultural diversity in her musical expressions, becoming known locally and internationally for her charismatic performances. University of Hartford's pioneer in guitar pedagogy Richard Provost says: "Ms. García is a strong performer/musician who, through her technical control, projects the character and beauty of the music. Her engaging personality coupled with her technical/musical control makes her performances a true musical experience for the listener." Fulbright scholar and composer Thomas Schuttenhelm adds that she possesses "a sensuality surpassing expression", "giving a new direction to performance practice and the art of playing the guitar", "an elegant tone with serious musical intentions". "Ms. Garcia has an intuitive technical facility that makes every performance sound as if it is a premiere." Yovianna has launched a suc-

cessful international career initiated by the release of her first classical guitar solo album in June 2011 entitled "Portrait", leading to tours in the USA, Puerto Rico, Brazil, and Dominican Republic. She has also collaborated with artists such as Berta Rojas and Paquito D'Rivera.

THIBAULT CAUVIN (FRANCE) - SATURDAY, MARCH 14TH, 2015, 2:00 PM



Thibault Cauvin is one of the most talented, charismatic and sought-after guitarists in the world today. He travels the globe throughout the year, invited by the most prestigious festivals and concert halls, such as New York's Carnegie Hall, Shanghai Opera House, Moscow's Tchaikovski Hall, London's Wigmore Hall, Hong Kong Opera House, the Paris Théâtre des Champs Elysées and the Munich Gasteig. He has already given over 1000 concerts in 120 countries, receiving rave reviews by the critics. Thibault has participated in many TV and radio shows and has collaborated with many renowned musicians, composers and symphony orchestras. Thibault is known as an innovative and creative performer, always working on the evolution of the classical music. After recording 5 CDs, and having been the subject of the documentary film "Thibault Cauvin across China" by NP Morin, Thibault signed with Sony Music in 2013 and recorded "Dance with Scarlatti". This album climbed to the Top 10 for French classical music sales and remained there for 3 months. This CD has met with worlwide acclaim and receives frequent broadcast as a favorite amongst the top radio stations in France and beyond.

SUCCESSFUL SUMMER FOR MARK WILSON



Mark Hilliard Wilson has had a busy summer — with a Hootenany in Halfway, Oregon; concerts in cathedrals in Spain; and conducting, concertizing, and teaching in Calgary, Canada. He has started recording a CD of the music from these concerts at Empty Sea Studios and hopes to have a finished product by December 2014.

Mark reports that he feels fortunate to have combined so much of his family life this summer with his passion for performing music and a

desire to see the world. Despite the frantic pace, he found opportunities to slow down and enjoy life. For example, he picked cherries with his 8 year old daughter on his cousin's farm which is nestled in the valley between the Wallowa National Forest and Hell's Canyon in Eastern Oregon, and later met up with the local musicians for a chance to call songs out and play them in a circle. The highlight of this experience was when his daughter joined and played one of three pieces from her repertoire book. The musicians recognized it as an old calypso song and joined in with the words and all. Another neat moment was when the local musicians joined in for a jam session on a 16th century Spanish Baroque guitar piece.

After the road trip to see family in Idaho and Oregon, it was back to work on a transcription of sinfonia by the little known 17th century Italian/German composer Giuseppe Brescianello for Guitar Orchestra. This, along with a new Guitar Orchestra composition he composed, were the featured premieres at a guitar festival in Calgary. They will be available to the public through his publisher Second Prattica in the first weeks of October 2014.

The summer was capped off with a two-week residency in the small town of Carrion de los Condes, Spain which is the halfway mark of the Camino de Santiago. The residency consisted of playing concerts in Romanesque cathedrals for locals and pilgrams of the Camino de Santiago.

If you are not familiar with the Camino de Santiago de Compostella, it is a pilgramage route that has been travelled since the 1200's when the supposed remains of the apostle St. James were found in a peasent's field, in what was then the frontier of a Moorish kingdom. The most common starting point of the 500 mile pilgramge route is in France at the foot of the Pyrenees mountains. The person walking through time, in mind and body, concludes the trip after traversing forests, deserts, and high plains and yet again more mountains— in all of the weather you can imagine—at the cathedral in Santiago de Compstella. Highlights of this part of the trip were:

• Playing two of the Cantigas de Santa Maria (Songs of St. Mary) in the church that they were written in over 800 years ago. The Cantigas de Santa Maria are akin to the Bayuex tapestry or the Song of Roland in terms of cultural hegemeny.

Embracing the poetry of the momnent while literally being in the middle of the wheat fields of Spain when playing the compositon of the same title en los trigales by the great Spanish composer Joaquin Rodrigo.

• Visiting the gorgeous town of Burgos where the great Spanish guitarist Narciso Yepes was born. The last two pieces on his program were written for Yepes, en los trigales and Cancion y Danza.

Being able to do all of this with my wife and daughter, along with seeing the El Greco and more in the Prado, Guerneca at the Museo de Modern art, ruins of castles, cathedrals and the rich discussions of what is art and history. Oh! and the food and the people!!

Randy Hathaway is in the middle of recording a double CD with almost 100 minutes of original compositions for classical guitar. A variety of solos, duos, trio and a quartet with guest instruments of flute, viola and voice will encompass his project. Approximately 15 musicians in all including Graham Banfield, Jason Williams, Robert Vierschilling, Jessica Papkoff, Michael Nicolella, Mark Wilson, Sean Owen, Eric Branner, Monty Robinson and more! Randy will keep us updated on when the CD and sheet music becomes available.

Jessica Papkoff was busy in the recording studio this Summer performing on two recording projects. The first was Randy Hathaway's CD project (see above) and she also recorded several tracks for Grammy-nominated songwriter, Henta Ellis, on her upcoming CD project, "Beautiful Creation".

In September, Michael Nicolella performed with violinist Gil Shaham at the Seattle Symphony's season opening concert and gala. Michael has become a regular with the Seattle Symphony, having performed fourteen concerts with them in the past year alone. These included a performance of Fausto Romitelli's "Professor Bad Trip" on the symphony's groundbreaking "untitled" series as well as performances with Broadway legends Bernadette Peters and Brian Stokes Mitchell and classical music comedians Ingudesman and Joo.

Also in September, Michael released a double album of his arrangement of the Complete Bach Cello Suites. Reviewing the album in the Seattle Weekly, critic Gavin Borchert stated: "his playing is impeccable even in the face of head-spinning difficulties... as ravishing a guitar tone, both lush and crystalline, as I've ever heard on record." 
