DAVID RUSSELL (SCOTLAND / SPAIN) – SATURDAY, MARCH 5TH, 2016, 7:30 PM



The Seattle Classic Guitar Society is thrilled to present Grammy Award winner, **David Russell**, on the International Concert Series. Our relationship with David goes back many years and he has become one of the most popular artists that we have the honor of presenting here. Not only is he a fan favorite amongst concert-goers, but his master classes are also top-notch and extremely popular. Get your tickets now before this concert sells out!

Classical guitarist David Russell is world renowned for his superb musicianship and inspired artistry, having earned the highest praise from audiences and critics alike. In recognition of his great talent and his international career, he was named a Fellow of The Royal Academy of Music in London in 1997.

David Russell was a Grammy Award winner in 2005 for his CD, "Aire Latino", in the category of Best Instrumental Soloist in Classical Music. He received an Honorary Doctorate in Music by the University of Arizona in Tucson in 2014.

In May 2003 he was bestowed the great honor of being made "adopted son" of Es Migjorn, the town in Minorca where he grew up. Later the town named a street after him, "Avinguda David Russell". In November 2003 he was given the Medal of Honor of the Conservatory of the Balearics. After winning the Grammy Award, the town of Nigrán in Spain where he resides, gave him the silver medal of the town in an emotional ceremony.

During his studies at the Royal Academy, David Russell won twice the Julian Bream Guitar Prize. Later he won numerous international competitions, including the Andrés Segovia Competition, the José Ramírez Competition and Spain's prestigious Francisco Tárrega Competition.

David Russell spends his time touring the world, appearing regularly at prestigious halls in main cities, such as New York, London, Tokyo, Los Angeles, Madrid, Toronto or Rome. Concert-goers everywhere are in awe of his musical genius and inspired by his captivating stage presence. His love of his craft resonates through his flawless and seemingly effortless performance. The attention to detail and provocative lyrical phrasing suggest an innate understanding of what each individual composer was working to achieve, bringing to each piece a sense of adventure.

In May 2005 he received a homage from the music conservatory of Vigo, culminating with the opening of the new Auditorium, to which they gave the name "Auditorio David Russell". In 2009 David was named honorary member of "Amigos de la Guitarra", the oldest guitar society in Spain.

Since 1995 David Russell has an exclusive recording contract with Telarc International, with which he has recorded sixteen CDs up to now, among them "Aire Latino", which received a Grammy in 2005.

The New York Times wrote about his performance: "... Mr. Russell made his mastery evident without ever deviating from an approach that places musical values above mere display. It was apparent to the audience throughout the recital that Mr. Russell possesses a talent of extraordinary dimension".

Upon hearing him play in London, Andrés Segovia wrote: "My congratulations on your musicality and guitaristic technique".

Classical guitarist, pedagogue and educator Isaac Bustos, enjoys an extensive performing career that has taken him to Canada, Central America, Europe and all over the US. Isaac has appeared as soloist with the Orchestra of New Spain, The Baytown Symphony Orchestra, The Nicaraguan National Symphony Orchestra and the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra, Isaac holds an impressive number of top prizes in over 12 major international competitions, 7 of which are first prizes. In 2008, Isaac released his debut CD, "Caprichos y Sonatas" which Soundboard magazine described as "...one of the best... it has everything one could want." Bustos holds a Bachelor of Music degree in guitar performance from the University of New Hampshire, a Master of Music degree from the University of Texas at Austin where he also completed a Doctor of Musical Arts degree with world-renowned American guitarist Adam Holzman. Bustos is also a founding member of and performs regularly with the award-winning Texas Guitar Quartet. Since 2005, Dr. Bustos serves on the faculty at Texas A&M University Department of Performance Studies where he is head of guitar studies and artistic director of the Texas A&M International Guitar Symposium and Competition.

2016 NW Guitar Festival & Competition

The 2016 Northwest Guitar Festival will be held in Moscow, Idaho on April 1-3 at the Lionel Hampton School of Music on the University of Idaho campus. Three days packed with fantastic classical guitar related events, the festival will include daily technique and guitar orchestra workshops, as well as performances and masterclasses. Festival artists include Michael Nicolella, South Hill Guitars, The Oregon Guitar Quartet, David Feingold, Michael Videon, Mark Wilson, Michael Millham, and Paul Grove. The event will feature both an adult solo classical guitar competition, and a youth competition for individuals 18 and under. 2016 Solo Classical Guitar Competition - Adult Competition

The 2016 Northwest Festival Competition will take place on April 1-3, 2016 in Moscow, Idaho and is open to all guitarists regardless of age living or studying in Alaska, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, Washington, Alberta, British Columbia and Saskatchewan. Entrants should be students or at the beginning of their professional career. Eligibility on these criteria is subject to the discretion of the organizing board. Previous 1st prizewinners of the competition will not be eligible.

Prizes: 1st Prize: \$1000.00, 2nd Prize: \$500.00, 3rd Prize: \$300.00, 4th Prize: \$200.00

Competition Format

The competition will be conducted in three rounds – music selections may be repeated in subsequent rounds.

- 1) Qualifying Round by submitted recording. The set piece is ANY two preludes from Bryan Johanson's 24 Preludes.
- 2) Semi-Final Round chosen from the Qualifying Round. Live performance before a panel of judges and open to the public.
- 3) Final Round before a panel of judges and open to the public.

Qualifying Round

- 1) A recording of the set pieces plus a free choice (the free choice cannot exceed 5 minutes in duration) can be submitted as an MP3 via email (10 MB attachment limit), a link to YouTube or Soundcloud, or a physical CD.
- 2) A typed copy of your proposed program to be performed in the final round, maximum 20 minutes of music. Tuning or pausing between the selections is not included in the timing.
- 3) Contact information, including name, phone number and email address.

The 2016 Northwest Festival Competition will take place on April 1-3rd, 2016 in Moscow, ID and is open to all guitarists 18 or under on July 1 2016, residing in Alaska, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, Washington, Alberta, British Columbia and Saskatchewan. Eligibility on these criteria is subject to the discretion of the organizing board. Previous 1st prizewinners of the competition will not be eligible.
