SCGS is thrilled to present Brasil Guitar Duo on our series for the first time! Brasil Guitar Duo, a 2006 winner of the Concert Artists Guild International Competition, and hailed by Classical Guitar magazine for its *"maturity of musicianship and technical virtuosity,"* is equally at home on a classical or a world-music series. Its innovative programming features a seamless blend of traditional and Brazilian works, resulting in a full global touring schedule and a growing catalogue of critically acclaimed recordings. The Duo has appeared internationally on major concert series and at festivals in Cuba, Germany, England, South Korea, Colombia, Brazil, Austria, Panama, Poland, and Bermuda.

Committed to performing new chamber music employing the guitar, the Duo joined cellists Yo-Yo Ma and Carlos Prieto in the October 2014 world premiere of "El arco y la lira", a work for two cellos and two guitars by the esteemed Cuban composer Leo Brouwer. On the same program, a highlight of the sixth annual Festival Leo Brouwer in Havana, the Duo gave the Cuban premiere of Brouwer's "Sonata de Los Viajeros".

Brasil Guitar Duo actively strives to expand the repertoire for two guitars, with Lora contributing works of his own and Luiz arranging both classical and Brazilian music. Appearing frequently in diverse nontraditional spaces, the Duo brings a broad repertoire of classical guitar duos (Bach, Sor, Scarlatti, Debussy, etc.) combined with such traditional Brazilian dance forms as choro, samba, maxixe, and baião.

South Hill Guitars formed in 2014 and has performed at many Northwest venues including the Northwest Guitar Society in Bellingham, WA, the 2016 Northwest Guitar Festival in Moscow, ID, and at Gonzaga University. Guitarists James Reid and John Paul Shields share a love for South American music as well as contemporary compositions. The duo has recently programmed works by Maximo Pujol, Jaime Zenamon, Alfonso Montes, and Celso Machado. The duo has also had works written for it by William Whitley and Jacob Johnson. South Hill Guitars received a grant in 2016 to record their debut CD, Lonesome Coyote.

James Reid has had an extensive solo career and has released eight solo CDs. The most recent of which was Guitarra Americana. Currently, James Reid, the founder of the Northwest Guitar Festival, directs the guitar program at the University of Idaho. John Paul's career recently took him to Peru, where he studied the rich intricacies of Andean folk guitar music. He worked with several renowned musicians in Peru, including Frank Collazos, Luis Salazar Mejía and the legendary Ayacuchan guitarist Raúl García Zárate, Mr. Shields teaches guitar at the Holy Names Center and Spokane Falls Community College in Spokane, WA.

Guitarist of extraordinary passion and virtuosity, **Gaëlle Solal** was born in Marseilles (France) and began playing the guitar at age 6 with René Bartoli. At 14, she won three gold medals at the Conservatoire de Marseilles and as the best student among all instruments, was awarded the Prix de la Ville de Marseille. She is the winner of 1st Grand Prix at multiple competitions including Alessandria Competition, Locquémeau, Savona, Sernancehle, and Finalist at Concert Artists Guild New York, Honor Diplom at Accademia Chigiana, and 2nd Prize at the Guitar Foundation of America competition. Gaëlle has performed in more than 35 countries. She has performed in prominent festivals including Festival dIle de France, Noches en los Reales Alcázares in Sevilla, Festival dAvignon, Festival Montpellier-Radio France and at Salle Cortot (Paris), Zellerbach Hall (Berkeley), Tsuda Hall, Nikkei Hall, Oji Hall in Tokyo, Merkin Concert Hall (NY), and at the Guitar Foundation of America's International Convention in 2011. She has been a soloist in concertos with the Berkeley Symphony, the Garde Républicaine Orchestra, and the Philharmonic of Turin Orchestra.


Alan Liu – March 31, 2018, 2:00 pm

"Just wow" said the CBC of Alan Xu Kun Liu in naming him to their 2016 list of 30 Hot Canadian Classical Musicians Under 30. Born in Xi'An, China in December of 2001, Alan began studying piano and guitar at the age of five. When he was seven he won his first national-class prize for guitar in Beijing and has since amassed an impressive list of top prizes in music competitions around the world. Alan currently studies with Michael Partington of the University of Washington and Daniel Bolshoy of the Vancouver Symphony School of Music. He was the first prizewinner of the Canadian National Music Competition (2016), the GFA International Youth Competition Junior Division (2014), Guitare Montreal International Youth Competition (2014) and the Northwest Guitar Festival Adult Competition (2015). Alan has performed in Canada, the US and China, including a concerto with the Vancouver Symphony in 2015 and as a featured artist in the 2015 Montreal International Guitar Festival.

CD REVIEW – by Jessica Papkoff

Seattle composer and guitarist, Randy Hathaway, has just released a monumental 2–CD set of his original compositions for classical guitar entitled "Classical Guitar in America". There is over an hour and a half of music in this collection that includes guitar solos, duos, trios, a quartet, plus guitar with flute, viola and voice.

This recording is remarkable in that it includes 18 musicians (mostly from Seattle) comprising 13 different classical guitarists and 5 other instrumentalists and vocalists. The performances are all top quality both technically and aurally which is no small feat when attempting to attain sonic consistency across 35 tracks with 13 different guitarists and other instruments in all of these different configurations.

Randy's music, as he describes in the liner notes, contains influences of classical, folk, jazz and modern idioms as well as Latin and European flavors. "Classical Guitar in America" is a musical landscape of places and seasons interspersed with shorter pieces, songs and dances. The main anchors are the longer multi-movement pieces beginning with *American Sonata* for guitar duo, *Autumn, Spring Overture, Winter's Arrival,* and *Diurnal Summer* for guitar solo, *Exodus* for guitar and viola, *Engage* for guitar and flute, and *Concord* for guitar trio. The music spans a wide range of styles and textures, with lots of memorable melodies, rhythms and chordal material.

For me, the major musical works evoke images of the vast and varied landscapes of Washington state, the feelings of the seasons, of change, of Winter's chill, of far away memories and of contemplation. The music is often reminiscent of Aaron Copland, in that very American tradition that describes the beautiful expansiveness of our country. The songs and other shorter pieces bring one back to more familiar territory such as the very Spanish influenced *Gypsy de*



The performances on these CDs are all excellent and the wide variety of ensembles makes for a fun and memorable listening adventure. My personal favorites are *Engage* and *Exodus*, really beautiful and thoughtful music. I highly recommend this CD set!

In addition to the CD release, Randy has also self-published the music scores for all of the pieces on this recording! I think this must be a first; a 2–CD classical guitar release of all original compositions plus all of the music published and available to purchase. If you're looking to learn and program new music, these compositions represent a significant new addition to the modern classical guitar repertoire for both solo guitar and ensemble.


